

### **Old Testament Reading:**

Song of Solomon 2:8-13

The voice of my beloved! Behold, he comes, leaping upon the mountains, bounding over the hills. <sup>9</sup> My beloved is like a gazelle, or a young stag. Behold, there he stands behind our wall, gazing in at the windows, looking through the lattice. <sup>10</sup> My beloved speaks and says to me: "Arise, my love, my fair one, and come away: <sup>11</sup> for lo, the winter is past, the rain is over and gone. <sup>12</sup> The flowers appear on the earth, the time of singing has come, and the voice of the turtledove is heard in our land. <sup>13</sup> The fig tree puts forth its figs, and the vines are in blossom: they give forth fragrance. Arise, my love, my fair one, and come away.

### **New Testament Reading:**

Mark 7:1-23

<sup>1</sup>Now when the Pharisees gathered together to him, with some of the scribes, who had come from Jerusalem, <sup>2</sup> they saw that some of his disciples ate with hands defiled, that is, unwashed. <sup>3</sup> (For the Pharisees, and all the Jews, do not eat unless they wash their hands, observing the tradition of the elders; <sup>4</sup> and when they come

from the market place, they do not eat unless they purify themselves; and there are many other traditions which they observe, the washing of cups and pots and vessels of bronze.) <sup>5</sup> And the Pharisees and the scribes asked him, "Why do your disciples not live according to the tradition of the elders, but eat with hands defiled?" <sup>6</sup> And he said to them, "Well did Isaiah prophesy of you hypocrites, as it is written,

'This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far from me; <sup>7</sup> in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines the precepts of men.'

<sup>8</sup>You leave the commandment of God, and hold fast the tradition of men."

<sup>9</sup> And he said to them, "You have a fine way of rejecting the commandment of God, in order to keep your tradition! <sup>10</sup> For Moses said, 'Honor your father and your mother'; and, 'He who speaks evil of father or mother, let him surely die'; <sup>11</sup> but you say, 'If a man tells his father or his mother, What you would have gained from me is Corban' (that is, given to God)<sup>[f]</sup>— <sup>12</sup> then you no longer permit him to do anything for his father or mother, <sup>13</sup> thus making void the word of God through your tradition which you hand on. And many such things you do."

<sup>14</sup> And he called the people to him again, and said to them, "Hear me, all of you, and understand: <sup>15</sup> there is nothing outside a man which by going into him can defile him; but the things which come out of a man are what defile him." <sup>17</sup> And when he had entered the house, and left the people, his disciples asked him about the parable. <sup>18</sup> And he said to them, "Then are you also without understanding? Do you not see that whatever goes into a man from outside cannot defile him, <sup>19</sup> since it enters, not his heart but his stomach, and so passes on?" (Thus he declared all foods clean.) <sup>20</sup> And he said, "What comes out of a man is what defiles a man. <sup>21</sup> For from within, out of the heart of man, come evil thoughts, fornication, theft, murder, adultery, <sup>22</sup> coveting, wickedness, deceit, licentiousness, envy, slander, pride, foolishness. <sup>23</sup> All these evil things come from within, and they defile a man."
