## Old Testament Reading:

### Job 42:1-6 & 10-17

<sup>1</sup> Then Job answered the Lord:

<sup>2</sup> "I know that thou canst do all things,  
and that no purpose of thine can be thwarted.

<sup>3</sup> 'Who is this that hides counsel without knowledge?'  
Therefore I have uttered what I did not understand,  
things too wonderful for me, which I did not know.

<sup>4</sup> 'Hear, and I will speak;  
I will question you, and you declare to me.'

<sup>5</sup> I had heard of thee by the hearing of the ear,  
but now my eye sees thee;

<sup>6</sup> therefore I despise myself,  
and repent in dust and ashes."

<sup>10</sup> And the Lord restored the fortunes of Job, when he had prayed for his friends; and the Lord gave Job twice as much as he had before. <sup>11</sup> Then came to him all his brothers and sisters and all who had known him before, and ate bread with him in his house; and they showed him sympathy and comforted him for all the evil that the Lord had brought upon him; and each of them gave him a piece of money and a ring of gold. <sup>12</sup> And the Lord blessed the latter days of Job more than his beginning; and he had fourteen thousand sheep, six thousand camels, a thousand yoke of oxen, and a thousand she-asses. <sup>13</sup> He had also seven sons and three daughters. <sup>14</sup> And he called the name of the first Jemi'mah; and the name of the second Kezi'ah; and the name of the third Ker'en-hap'puch. <sup>15</sup> And in all the land there were no women so fair as Job's daughters; and their father gave them inheritance among their brothers. <sup>16</sup> And after this Job lived a hundred and forty years, and saw his sons, and his sons' sons, four generations. <sup>17</sup> And Job died, an old man, and full of days.
