The Story Behind

...the hymn *"O Little Town of Bethlehem"*

During a trip to the Holy Land in 1865, Phillips Brooks went to the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem on Christmas Eve for worship. He was deeply moved by this experience.

Three years later, while pastoring the Holy Trinity Church in Philadelphia, he desired to have a special carol for the children to sing in their Sunday school Christmas program. Remembering the peaceful scene from his visit to Bethlehem, he completed writing the text in one evening.

He gave a copy of the words to his organist, Lewis R. Redner, and request that Lewis compose a melody that would be easy for the children to sing. Lewis didn't come up with the tune, until the evening before the program was to be performed. In fact, he was sleeping and woke up with the tune in his mind. He wrote it out and "O Little Town of Bethlehem" has been a favorite with children and adults around the world since that time.

In the middle of all the rush and activity of the Christmas season, take time to rejoice in the joy of Christ's birth.
