

The Story Behind:

One day successful author, business man, and devout Presbyterian layman Anthony J. Showalter received letters from two different friends, telling him of

their recent bereavements. In sending message of comfort to them, Mr. Showalter included Deut. 33:22 "The eternal God is your refuge, and underneath are the everlasting arms..." As he ended his letters, the thought occurred to him that this verse would be a fine theme for a hymn. He jotted down the words and music for the refrain.



Thinking that he should have some help in completing

song verses based on this scripture, he asked his friend Elisha Hoffman, a pastor and author of many gospel songs, to help. The hymn was then published in 1887 in the "Glad Evangel for Revival, Camp and Evangelist Meetings Hymnal."
